



The recently developed changing-room and shower facilities of a council-run sports pavilion in Leatherhead, benefit from a durable and quick to clean Ryebrook Resin flooring system with coved skirting, helping ensure the amenities remain attractive and welcoming to all users. Ideal for a location that will inevitably become wet and extremely muddy, a resin floor creates a totally tanked area that can easily be hosed down. Being seamless, there are no cracks or joints in the floor where dirt can become trapped whilst a slip resistant finish makes it safe even when wet.

Project managed by Grove Millican, the extension to the existing pavilion has been partly funded by the Football Association and has included two separate changing rooms with shower areas as well as a private changing room with shower for match officials. Ryebrook was appointed by Millane Contract Services Ltd to lay their Ryegrip quartz system which consists of a single layer of quartz aggregate effectively being sandwiched between two layers of epoxy resin to deliver exceptional anti-slip properties.

After sanding down the base surface with an STR rotary sanding machine a surface damp proof membrane was laid to protect the subsequent flooring system from moisture from freshly laid concrete. A binder coat was then

laid and blinded out with coloured quartz aggregate. Post-cure, excess aggregate was removed before final, clear seal coats were applied, leaving sufficient texture to give the required level of slip resistance. A 100mm radius coved skirting was also formed to the walls to simplify the cleaning process and maximise hygiene levels.
